# Collection of good practices

### D3.1: Expandable repository of good practices

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#### Abstract

An important task within the SKIN project aims at running a comprehensive scouting of good practices across Europe, identified through the criteria established earlier in the project. The collection of good practices is divided into two phases and following the data and information protocol as defined in a previous task by Teagasc (see deliverable document 2.1). During phase 1 all SKIN consortium partners collect good practices for their own regions and/or countries in order to generate an enormous amount of structured information on pan-European short food supply chain cases, allowing to identify significant issues and bottlenecks across the EU. Phase 2 intends to capture the dynamics of the good practices identified through a longer period of time and will at the same time perform an update of information and data related to best practices already identified in Phase 1.

In order to help the SKIN consortium partners during Phase 1, a step by step guide was developed by Adrienn Molnar and Ray Jacobsen (UGent). This step by step guide contains several interim deadlines following a bottom-up approach in order to guarantee a smooth and continuous process of data collection across the EU.

This deliverable document indicates the path that has been followed to collect the good practices on the one hand and to obtain the repository on the other hand. It clearly illustrates how the hot topics were selected, documents provided to the SKIN consortium partners, demonstrated with some exemplary good practices (one for each topic) within this deliverable as the others will be searchable and displayed on the SKIN website. Finally, a short assessment summarizing the content and main trends of Phase 1 is presented.
