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Abstract

The Working Groups (WGs) are organized based on the first phase of the good practices collection. Their structure and their role were defined during the 3rd project meeting (05-06 October 2017, Paris) on the agreement between the project coordinator, the Executive Committee and the Working Groups Leaders. The 6 working groups will manage the “innovation challenges workshops” (ICWs) to promote innovation driven research. They are principally aimed to identify specific aspects, experiences and shortcomings in short food supply chains (SFSCs) management that might generate demand driven innovations.

The WGs are connected to the activities of Foresight Exercises (Fes) and ICWs focusing on the actual needs of SFSCs practitioners. Therefore ICWs are aligned with the issues addressed by the Working Groups.

After the WGs set up, all involved partners are actively working on planning and organizing workshops for the next year. These workshops will be held by experts, representatives of
